Saints to celebrate this week

St Catherine of Siena, 29 April: c. 1333-1380, A member of the Dominican Third Order, Catherine Benincasa was the youngest of twenty or more children of a Sienese dyer. She devoted time to prayer and penance, helping the sick in hospital. She later journeyed in a call to reform and repentance. In the last five years of her life, she was involved in the politics of Church and State, working for the return of the papacy from Avignon to Rome. This makes here one of the leading figures of the fourteenth century. Both a contemplative and ascetic, her writings are remarkable for their spirituality and theology.

St Joseph the Worker, 1st May: Responding to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists, Pius XII instituted the feast of St Joseph the Worker in 1955. But the relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers has a much longer history.

St Athanasius, 2nd May: (c.296-373) was bishop of Alexandria and attended the first Council of Nicea. Athanasius was the greatest champion of Catholic belief on the subject of the Incarnation that the Church has ever known and in his lifetime earned the characteristic title of "Father of Orthodoxy"

Ss Philip and James, 3rd May: Philip an apostle, came from Bethsaida and after following John the Baptist became an early follower of Jesus. He persuaded Nathaniel (probably Bartholomew) to follow Jesus too.

(Ss Philip and James cont): When the Greeks wanted to meet Jesus they approached Philip first. Tradition has him preaching the Gospel in Phrygia and dying in Hierapolis. James, son of Alphaeus is sometimes identified with the James whose mother stood by Jesus on the cross. Also he is often called the first bishop of Jerusalem and identified with the author of the Epistle of St. James, otherwise nothing is known with certainty about him. His traditional iconographic emblem is a fuller's club because he was believed to have been beaten to death with it, after being sentenced by the Sanhedrin in AD62 to be stoned.

The English Martyrs, 4th May: In the New Calendar for English Saints the 40 canonised martyrs (previous feast on 25th October) have joined the 85 beatified martyrs for today's Feast, with other martyrs from the 16th and 17th centuries. These are now known as 'The English Martyrs'. It was on 4th May 1535 that three Carthusian monks were put to death at Tyburn, the first of many martyrs. Of these martyrs 42 have been canonised and a further 242 declared blessed, but the number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or suffered harsh persecution for their faith in the course of a century and a half cannot now be reckoned. They came from every walk of life; there are among them rich and poor, married and single, women and men. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith, and courage in the face of persecution.
