Saints this Week



St Charles Borromeo, Monday 4th November: 1538-84. Charles was born of an aristocratic family. Aged 22 he gained his doctorate, by which time his uncle had become pope Pius IV and

heaped honours on his nephew now living in some style in Rome. Charles desired to leave the papal court and perhaps become a monk but he was dissuaded from this. He became very influential in the final session of the Council of Trent particularly in draft Ing the He had considerable influence on the Counter-Reformation, in he was ordained priest and consecrated bishop and as papal legate for all Italy, he held a provincial council in Milan and set about reform. Famine struck Milan twice and each time he was prominent in aiding the hungry and nursing the plague-stricken, not only organising the relief work but taking a personal part in it.

St Faustina Kowalska, Tuesday 5th Nov



Sister Faustina (1905-1938) was a young, nun of simple education in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came

from a poor family that struggled during World War I. Sr. Faustina received extraordinary revelations — or messages — from our Lord, who asked her to record these experiences. She did this in notebooks, known today as the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska - words of God's loving message of Divine Mercy.
